Sermon

RESPONSE TO THE WORD

* Affirmation of Faith Hymnal Pg. 37, Sections 1-2 Jesus portion of The Brief Statement of Faith, 1991, The Book of Confessions, Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) In life and death we belong to God. Through the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God. and the communion of the Holy Spirit, we trust in the one triune God, the Holy One of Israel, whom alone we worship and serve. We trust in Jesus Christ, fully human, fully God. Jesus proclaimed the reign of God: preaching good news to the poor and release to the captives, teaching by word and deed and blessing the children, healing the sick and binding up the brokenhearted, eating with outcasts, forgiving sinners, and calling all to repent and believe the gospel. Unjustly condemned for blasphemy and sedition, Jesus was crucified, suffering the depths of human pain and giving his life for the sins of the world. God raised Jesus from the dead, vindicating his sinless life, breaking the power of sin and evil, delivering us from death to life eternal.

Almighty God, receive these prayers we offer, and by the power of your Holy Spirit make us witnesses to the glorious resurrection of Jesus Christ, through whom we pray. Amen.
