Candle Lighting Liturgy

Worship Leader: Over a hundred people, from the ages of two to eighty

years old, were asked to fill in the blank for the statement: "My story is. . . " From the voices of different generations,

hear their answers:

Teenager: Amazing!

Child: Just beginning.

Adult: A wee bit messy, with lots of love.

Older Adult: Privileged. Teenager: Hopeful.

Child: Full of silliness.
Adult: Still unfolding.
Older Adult: Long, but good.
Teenager: One of resilience.

Child: Incomplete, thank goodness.

Adult: Multilingual.

Older Adult: A work in progress.

Teenager: My story is not just mine, it's tied to yours.

Older Adult: Tonight we tell the story that we tell every year—the story of Christ's birth, the story of love made flesh. It's a story that weaves through every generation. It's a story that picks up the bits and pieces of our narrative and braids us together.

Invitation to the Lord's Table

Every Christmas Eve, we gather together in this same room, to tell the same story of a baby born in a manger.

The plot never changes. There are never any surprise twists.

So why do we do it? Why do we keep telling this same story?

We tell this story because our spirits need to hear it.

Over and over and over again, like water in the desert,

we need to be reminded that God has drawn close to this hurting world.

We need to be reminded that God just couldn't stay away.

This is true on Christmas Eve, and it is true at this Table.

Every time we gather at this Table, we tell the same story—the story of a Messiah who gathered his friends together for one last supper,

the story of a Messiah who loved us so much he just couldn't stay away.

So friends, bring the parts of you that feel like the desert.

Bring the parts of you that are aching to hear this story again, because this good news is for you.

The Great Prayer of Thanksgiving

Author of our lives, we admit that there is something so marvelous and wonderful about this night: the glow of the candlelight, and the familiar hymns, the kids that are wound tight with contagious, joyful energy, the feeling that something we've been waiting for just might be within reach.

Joy and hope are in the air—so thick we could almost bottle it up.

But we don't want to bottle up this feeling; we want to share it.

We want to share the joy of this night with the children of this city, with single parents, with lonely young adults, with our unhoused neighbors, with those who are grieving, with people who couldn't quite make it home for Christmas.

We want to share this hope with people who had imagined that this year would be different,

that this year they would have what they were looking for.

We want to share this night with families

who couldn't afford to put much under the tree,

as well as with those who are new to this country—

fleeing a life that was unsafe or unwelcoming.

We don't want to bottle up the magic of this night; we want to share it.

We want to pour your good news all over this community.

We want to sing like Mary sang,

until all who are looking for you have found their way home.

So help us live like the shepherds—

who weren't afraid to go and tell the good news.

Help us take the words of the angels to heart—to not be afraid.

Help us to be as trusting as Joseph—who chose to believe the impossible.

But more than anything,

give us the courage and conviction to tell this story.

In a hurting world so desperate for hope, we have something to say.

Joy and hope are in the air—so thick we could almost bottle it up.

But we don't want to bottle up this feeling; we want to share it.

So pour out your Spirit on this Table.

Strengthen us from the inside out.

As we tell your story of good news,

let us once again speak the prayer your son taught us to pray, saying: **Our Father...**

Words of Institution

(Breaking Bread)

The Lord Jesus on the night he was betrayed, took bread, and after giving thanks to God, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take, eat. This is my body, given for you.

Do this in remembrance of me.

(Pouring Wine)

In the same way, Jesus took the cup, saying: This cup is the new covenant sealed with my blood, shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this in remembrance of me.

Every time you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

Brothers and sisters, the gifts of God for the people of God.

Distribution of the Elements

While ushers give out bread to congregation,
Pastor does same for choir, liturgist, and pianist.
Then Pastor gives bread to ushers.
When all has been distributed, the Pastor speaks these words:

The body of Christ, broken for us all. (All eat bread).

The same process is used for the juice.
When all has been distributed, the Pastor speaks these words:

The blood of Christ, shed for us all. (All drink juice).

Then the pastor says:

The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you.

Prayer after Communion

Let us pray.

God of grace and peace, as you have shared your life with us through the child in the manger and this simple meal together, let us share your life with others as the body of Christ in the world; through Jesus, bread of heaven. Amen.

Benediction

Go into the night, glorifying and praising God for all you have seen and heard.

May Christ be your light, this night and forevermore.

STILLE NACHT

As the music plays, a candle lighter will come to the end of your pew. The candle of the first worshiper in each row will be lit and they will light the candle of the person next to them, in that way the light of Christ is passed from person to person.

(To avoid spilling hot wax, please keep your candle upright allowing the person next to you to light their candle.)

After all the candles are lit, we will stand to sing "Silent Night"

At the conclusion of Silent Night, please extinguish your candle as we depart the sanctuary in silence.
