Prelude

Translation: Bread of Angels make the bread of men:

Call to Worship (L = Leader, P = People)

- L: Lent is a time when we embark on a wilderness journey toward reconciliation and wholeness.It is a time when we let go of what is distracting us in our relationship with God.
- P: We have come here to recall who we are a people baptized into Jesus Christ, but a people who have not lived up to our calling. And so we are here to be called again by the all-powerful Word of God to a change of heart and a willingness to live out the demands of the Gospel of Jesus Christ.
- L: To hear that call more clearly, let us examine our lives in the light of the gospel. I invite you, therefore to the observance of a holy Lent,

by self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and service; and by reading and meditating on God's holy Word.
