Family Promise

Family Promise of Roane County continues to expand its efforts to assist families who are homeless or are in danger of becoming homeless.

We continue to shelter a family of two at Bethel. This family is still going through difficult times, with health and extended family issues. Please keep them in your prayers. They asked me to express their thanks for all you do.

We have a second family of three (mom, dad, 3-month-old boy) who will shelter at Harriman United Methodist. Dad is working at a fast-food restaurant. Mom will be working toward her GED.

A member of Harriman United Methodist has given Family Promise a house, which we hope to use for transitional housing. More information will follow later.

By the time this newsletter is delivered, Bethel will have completed our turn of providing meals. Delivery to two sites will be worked out. Thanks to all

who provide meals, money and gift cards. Our next turn will be the week of July 3rd.

Through the Prevention and Diversion component of Family Promise, another family with a one-year-old was saved from becoming homeless this month. Kingston United Methodist provided furniture and clothing to some of our families during the last two months. They have made the Clothes Closet available to Family Promise as needed.

Family Promise of Roane County received \$10,000 from Clayton Homes Prevention and Diversion Grant this month. It is a matching grant. This is an opportunity to double the impact of your donation.

Dear Friends. Happy season of Easter to each of you!
