Dear Bethel Family,

In the middle of the many “new things” God is doing in our midst – one of the most exciting things is how leadership is springing forth from young and old alike! This summer, Orlando Vanegas will be on staff at John Knox Camp and Bethel Presbyterian Church has other three young men (Treavor Cribbs, Diego Vanegas and Jared McGill) who have applied to participate in the Covenant Partner Program at John Knox Camp for 2009! Last year Orlando and Treavor were Covenant Partners. Covenant Partners take an active role in their church congregation after spending time at summer camp in intense training. During their training time, C.P.’s learn leadership skills, develop individual talents and gifts, and become familiar with a variety of educational resources. They also focus on personal growth by challenging themselves mentally, physically, and spiritually. This summer they will have the opportunity to put those skills into action working with John Knox Camps Day Camp Program. Covenant Partners join the Camp John Knox staff in many training exercises and educational experi-

ences. Covenant Partners spend three weeks at camp (excluding weekends). This is an incredible opportunity for our youth to work and serve in the camp environment. This is done in partnership with support of the session and congregation. Because we have a large number of Covenant Partners and campers this year – any donation to camp scholarships would be greatly appreciated! Covenant Partners for 2009 are: Jared McGill, Treavor Cribbs and Diego Vanegas. How blessed John Knox Camp is to have these young men as a part of their ministry team! a ministry of Kingston United Methodist Church and Bethel Presbyterian Church that equips lay persons to provide Christian one-to-one care for those who are going through difficult times; designed to provide care for those who are experiencing all kinds of life needs and circumstances, both in our congregation and community.

Stephen Ministers working together with our pastors to reach more people with Christian care than pastors can reach by themselves.

Trained lay members of the congregation offer Christian love and support on a one-on-one basis to those who are experiencing a loss, grief, or crisis in their lives. Stephen Ministers initially undertake 50 hours of training and continue to learn and grow through continuing education and supervision. Those who may benefit from a caring relationship with a Stephen Minister include those who are ill, facing surgery, unemployed, having marital difficulties, experiencing loneliness or depression, adjusting to the loss of loved one, job or location change, and many other situations where individual support is needed. Consider how you can serve in this exciting way!



*The Caregiver's Compass is a symbol that summarizes the most important characteristics of a Stephen Minister. It guides Stephen Ministers in their care giving and their learning. Stephen Ministers are compassionate caregivers; they share their care receiver's pain and help them bear it. They embody Jesus' promise to never let us suffer alone.*

*Stephen Ministers commit to 50 hours of training and ongoing care of people in need...meeting twice a month (after the initial training) for continuing education and peer supervision. We are planning another series of*

*Stephen Ministry Training at the end of the summer. Circle August 25<sup>th</sup> as the beginning of another class! Prayerfully consider if God is calling you to be a part of this wonderful ministry of caring! ## From the Parish Nurse



In 2004 the laws in Tennessee changed and the forms had to be updated. I have those forms here in my office for you in both English and Spanish. Please take time out of your busy schedule to take care of this important task if you haven't already. Both of these forms have areas to be notarized or witnessed. You may bring the forms by the church and I will notarize them for free. If you need the forms notarized or you have any questions, my hours are Tuesday- Thursday 9 A.M. - 3:30 P.M.

While we are on the subject of forms, there is a form that I have formulated to hopefully make funeral/ memorial service planning simpler. I know as the only surviving child in my family that

had to plan the funerals of both of my parents it was very hard. This form walks you through funeral planning as well as important information for next of kin that may be coming in from out of town. The forms are available Monday through Friday 9 A.M.-3 P.M. from Susan Cutts, our new administrative assistant. The funeral/ memorial forms will be secured in the Pastor/Parish Nurse's office.

When we think of Sevier County, TN, we often think of Pigeon Forge and Dollywood, unique craft shops and various children's attractions. We also might assume high employment in this area. While seasonal work might be available to many in Sevier, Cocke and Jefferson Counties, these jobs are usually minimal wage without benefits. This leaves many residents without income for a part of each year.

Sunset Gap began in the early 1900s as a Presbyterian sponsored mission school. Over the years, it served as a school, as the local medical facility and in some cases a home away from home for some of the children in the area. It has evolved into an active community center for the surrounding area with a large Thrift Shop that is kept supplied with toys, book, clothes and small appliances from Presbyterian Churches across the midwest and midwest. This store helps residences of the three county area supplement and, in some cases, carries them over during periods of unemployment or underemployment. Bethel, through coordination of the Mission Outreach Committee, has been an active supplier to the Thrift Shop for several years. The items we donate are sold through the Thrift Store for a small fee or in some cases are given to those in need.

Before our renovation project, Bethel was sending two to three truck and van loads of items to Sunset Gap every six weeks or so. Even this past year during our renovation, several individuals took items.

We are now ready to resume our collection of items that the Mission Outreach Committee hopes have been resting in your basements and closets over the past months and will start making regular trips to Sunset Gap again in the near future. Please watch the bulletin for a drop off place for your items.

*Landscape Committee*

The Landscape Committee has been hard at work. Hopefully, you will be seeing the beginnings of some of our plans within the next few weeks.

The stakes on the slopes indicate areas where larger rocks will be placed. Ted Daily helped us position the canopy trees on the flat, grassy areas where the stakes are located.

Many people wanted to see the sugar maples again and Ted agreed these were ideal trees to shade the patio area and frame the church. We appreciate Ted giving his time and expertise.

The mulch will be covered with black plastic to kill out the weeds that are coming up. This is a temporary measure and will be removed before Sunday services.

We appreciate the input from so many Bethel members and have a working list of suggestions as well as donations of time and plant material. We are now looking for any objects other than plant material that are being stored in various homes and that might be used in the landscape. Danny Holloway has the log church and Linda Brown has many old bricks and posts from the swing.

We are also looking for large rocks and pine straw. If you have large rocks you would like to donate to the landscape, please contact Cathy or Jane. Pine straw is a marvelous mulch. If you have a supply of pine straw or know you will have a supply later this year, please contact us.

Historical Perspectives on the Kingston/TVA Coal Ash Spill
