

STEWARDSHIP SUNDAY— STEP UP TO THE FUTURE

November 8, 2009

We will celebrate the stewardship of our church family on Stewardship Sunday, November 8th. With gratitude for the gifts given in the preceding year, we are each called to reflect on how we will dedicate our time, talents and treasures to God's work in the coming year.

Event 1: The Stewardship Fair will begin at 9:30 in the morning in the Gathering Area. The middle school youth will provide refreshments. The fair is focused on committee involvement. Find the "Start Here" table and pick up your commitment folder. Then visit the committee booths. Talk with committee members. Learn about each committee's ministries and share your visions of new ministries we could do. Tell us how you want to involve yourself with the work of Bethel by completing a Stewardship Fair form.

Event 2: Continue to celebrate stewardship in the worship service. Worship begins at our regular time, 11:00 A.M. Be with God as you decide how you will give of yourself and your finances next year. Bethel has operated for many years on a faith budget; that is, we have not asked for financial pledges from the congregation. We continue this tradition with a new request, that you complete a financial form that tells us about your offering plan for the coming year. Signatures are not required, but the results will help us build the 2010 operating budget and tell the mortgage lender we how we will pay for the mortgage. Commit to a plan of regular giving from the first fruits of your labor.



Event 3: Lunch will be served by Meals on Wheels, a program that feeds hundreds of Roane County shut-ins. On Stewardship Sunday the Meals on Wheels board members will personally donate soup, sandwiches, and dessert to the Bethel congregation. Please make a free will donation to Meals on Wheels during lunch. There are over 100 people on the waiting list and not enough funds to feed them. Join the luncheon fellowship following worship.

Your covenant forms for committee involvement and financial giving can be turned in during the fair, during worship or during lunch. Faithful stewardship is a responsibility, an act of worship and evidence of our faith. Step up to the future of Bethel on Stewardship Sunday.



Did You Know?



IRA Information for 2009

For anyone 70 ½ years old (or older) with an IRA account the following is true for this year only:

- 1. Normally you must take a distribution based on your age every year; the amount depends on the monies invested and your age. The Federal Government has made a change; due to the economy you are **not** required to take a distribution during 2009.
- 2. The Government has also made another change for 2009 only; namely, you can make a contribution to a charitable organization (Bethel qualifies) and **not** have to pay any income tax on said contribution. The check must be made out to the recipient, not to you personally; failure to do so will make the contribution taxable.
- 3. For those eligible, this is an excellent way to contribute to our building fund and not pay any income tax on the contribution. If you choose to do this it must be done prior to 12/31/09.
- 4. As always, we recommend discussing this with your tax advisor and or your investment counselor before proceeding.

From the Rarish Kurse

If it is not the candy corn of Halloween, it is the turkey and dressing of Thanksgiving. Holiday food is calling my name. I love this season and all its trimmings! Some of my fondest memories have been around the family table as we have munched and laughed. Even though I have to plan my sugar intake now because I am a diabetic, I do have an occasional meal that I end with a small dessert. Planning food and drink choices before holiday dining will help you keep those "party pounds" off. Before a holiday event, eating a snack or light meal helps to keep you from indulging in the heavier holiday meal. Foods high in protein, like chicken or cottage cheese, help you to eat less later. Fasting ahead of time to leave room for a big meal may lead you to overeat. I find it is better to drink unsweetened tea or water. At one time I was addicted to Diet Coke. I drank hardly any water at all. Soda has little or no nutritional value and is loaded with caffeine. Caffeine can lead to water retention. Alcoholic beverages and mixes contain a lot of sugar, so they are not good choices for drinks. Here are some tips for holiday eating:

Eat smaller portions of food. This is especially important at a buffet, where you may want to try everything. Choose the items you want to try the most, and eat a small portion of each. Eat slowly. We rush through eating many times so fast that our stomachs don't have time to register that they are full. Take time to savor each bite as if it were a hot fudge cake dripping with chocolate sauce......(sorry, I got carried away). After a meal, go for a walk with

your family to see holiday dis-

plays in your neighborhood. Offer to bring a low-calorie (or sugar-free!) dish to holiday parties. That way you will know there will be at least ONE healthy choice.

Don't park yourself in front of the buffet at a party. Mingle! If you stand by the buffet, you'll eat more than you would if it was across the room.

Avoid fast food that is often high in fat content. Prepare and freeze quick, healthy meals ahead of time.

Be realistic. Don't try to diet during the holidays; just aim to maintain your present weight. To your very good health — Deb

Focus for November-ANGEL FOOD MINISTRIES

Very early one Saturday morning each month, a dedicated group of volunteers from Bethel Presbyterian, First Baptist in Kingston and Potter's Grove gather at the United Way Building in Midtown to help distribute food from Angel Food Ministries.

This is a county-wide ministry that makes food available at very reasonable prices to anyone who wishes to participate. There are no qualifications or applications – anyone can purchase as much food as they like. Each month there is a different regular menu with a variety of specialty boxes of meats, veggies, and fruits. Recently, senior and convenience meals and allergen-free food boxes have been added. Thanksgiving and Christmas Holiday Boxes are also available for November and December.



I was in a hurry to get back to the church and put things away in the kitchen because I had to be somewhere that night. I was not thinking and I put the sausage in the freezer. I know what you are thinking right now....."Oh William you are kidding", (this is something my mom says whenever I do something that does not have a good ending). I left and ran a few more errands. Fast forward to Saturday morning and the kidnap breakfast. I had several parent volunteers ready to help cook breakfast.
