

Bethel's Opportunities

This church has a wonderful history and an open-to-possibility manner that helps define its ministry. It has also been led by visionary and loving pastors. And one of the things that I think is most important is that when Marc was ill, Pat and the lay leaders of this congregation rose to the challenges. Strong lay leadership is one of the great strengths of Bethel.

The church is full of very intelligent, creative, and gifted people, who are interested in the creative balance of faith and reason. It is not a lock-step congregation: it is one that engages, debates, values, and respects an individual's viewpoint – if it can be supported and substantiated.

Bethel is a church that takes chances and risks for the future. To take on the challenges, risks, and debt of the rebuilding process took a lot of faith and hope for the future. To do this with a sense that somehow God will find a way for Bethel to prosper was truly a "leap of faith". I know it will happen.

Bethel has embraced the BAM program (Bethel Arts Ministries) and many people of our own congregation as well as others in the community have grown and benefited from our endeavors. It has also led many leaders in the congregation to say, "Yes we can"! The arts will continue to be a frontier issue for Bethel and something that needs to be encouraged and identified as a defining and distinguishing aspect of Bethel's ministry.

There are educational challenges that exist in our community, but I know there are a number of really bright and creative retired folks in this congregation. Do you think we could conspire to form a mentoring/coaching for-

mat that we could use not only for our children but also for those outside our congregation? We've talked about mentoring. We need to make it happen. Has it ever occurred to you that maybe you have some wisdom to transfer to a next generation? I have to tell you that folks like Nelda Toon, George McGill, Jan Rybka, and others have a song to sing. These folks are priceless, and their stories are the unique. We need, as a congregation, to capture their stories. Greg Murr, Deb helped capture Jack Muecke's walkthru Bethel cemetery and remember the folks who are buried there. We need to have the perspective of honoring the past, celebrating the present, and believing in the future.

As your interim pastor, my charge is to help you move into the future. I want you to survive and grow, and will do anything I can to make that happen. But you must also want that growth and have the faith to believe it can happen,

What I want each of you do to is find someone and tell them about Bethel and why you are a member. It doesn't have to be special: it has to be real. That is what I have been trying to tell you since last Nov 1st. My whole point in preaching is to give you something to walk out the door with. My role, as pastor, is to equip you saints for the ministry of this church. The growth of this church is on your shoulders, not the new pastor's. He/she may have some new ideas about how to get to the Promised Land. You have to pick up the wagons and carry them there.

I'll get you to the river. You and your new pastor will cross. I believe in you and it will happen. I am for you! Blessings! Craig

The Faith Team needs your input. Our communion pitcher is topless! We have all the pieces, but are experiencing great difficulty in getting the pitcher repaired. It's been all the way to Ohio and numerous jewelers have weighed in on what's to be done over the last few months. Here's the bottom-line: it will cost a great deal of money to have the communion pitcher repaired (soldered back together and then re-silvered with no guarantee that the top will stay on!); it will cost a great deal of money to replace the communion pitcher with one that "matches" the plates (\$1,500+); it's just going to cost a lot of money!

The Faith Team would like to know the history of the communion ware so we can make the best decision regarding the repair and/or replacement of the communion pitcher (known as a flagon in churchy terms).

We have also received word

that a member would be willing to donate some antique silver (flagon, chalices, etc.) that were used by a family member who was a Presbyterian minister in the 1800s! The flagon and chalices would coordinate nicely with our current trays.

Please let Julie Bunch, Faith Team chair, know about the history of the communion ware! We strive to be the best stewards of our resources.
