

Several years ago our presbytery began offering an educational and fellowship event for the entire presbytery called Loaves and Fishes. I am particularly looking forward to the 2012 Loaves and Fishes experience because the theme is "Food for the Soul." As the brochure says, "Taking Jesus' command literally to 'feed my sheep,' we invite you to join in this conversation about feeding God's hungry people from growling stomachs to aching souls." This is a two day event Mar 16 and 17 at Maryville College in Maryville, TN.

There will be keynote speakers, worship, music and workshops as well as dinner Friday night at New Providence Presbyterian Church to experience and learn about their "Welcome Table" dinner begun a couple of years ago to feed those hungry for food and companionship. The workshops Sat morning and afternoon vary from food and faith to a pick-up band of musicians, to Living Waters for the world and Second Harvest, to Using social media and children's spirituality.

There are programs for children and youth as well as the adult programs. Essentially there is something for everyone. I am sure it will be an enriching event filled with great worship, good food, and lots of fellowship. Who knows, you may learn something at Loaves and Fishes that sparks an idea for ministry and mission at Bethel or you may find a workshop that would answer your questions or enhance


