### Dear Friends,

Ready or not, Lent is upon us. "Though the earliest traditions are unclear, Lent apparently evolved as a time for training, particularly as a time of final preparations of candidates for baptism at Easter. Lent also became a time for the renewal of the faithful. By the fourth century, Lent had developed from a two-day fast, through a week long fast, to a biblical 'forty days'. Originally, though Lent contained elements of penitence, it was primarily a time devoted to preparing those who were to be baptized. The Lenten season seems to have developed as a period of learning with a focus on what it means to be a follower of Christ. Those preparing for baptism learned the Creed, the teachings of Jesus (perhaps the Sermon on the Mount), and the disciplines of the Christian faith. The period of Lent had and still has an emphasis on reaffirming baptismal identity, of knowing and living the faith. During Lent, we have the opportunity to reaffirm who we are and always will be, in anticipation of Easter. " (taken from Liturgical Year: Supplemental Liturgical Resource 7).

This year we will begin Lent with a celebratory Shrove Tuesday dinner – a pancake dinner before the start of Lent on Ash Wednesday when we will have an imposition of the ashes service reminding us of our mortality and the need to die to our old life in order to be a new creation in Christ. Each Wednesday of Lent (minus March 21) we will meet together for a study called "Just Eating: Practicing our

Faith at the Table." During Holy Week we will worship together on Maundy Thursday and Good Friday. All of the Lenten opportunities for food, study and worship will be offered jointly with KUMC. A calendar of these events along with times and dates is included in the newsletter.

Make time this Lent to pray, to study, to reaffirm your baptismal promises and faithfully live the calling God has given you. People often give things up during Lent, but give thought this year to taking up a spiritual discipline instead. It could be more frequent daily devotion and prayer; it could be the studies on Wednesday nights; it could be service in the community. Whatever it is, be intentional so that what you take up might help to strengthen your faith and enrich your life.



# Souper Bowl of Caring

Our youth will hold soup pots at church doors on Souper Bowl of Caring Sunday, February 5, 2012. They will join young people in churches across the country to collect money for those who are hungry and hurting. In 2011, over \$10 million was collected by Souper Bowl of Caring participants for local charities. All of the money collected is donated to a charity selected by the participant - none of the money is sent to the Souper Bowl of Caring headquarters. Organizers only ask that each participant report their collection so national totals can be determined and announced. Since the Souper Bowl of Caring began in 1990, more than \$71 million has gone to help people in need. Please support the youth of our church in this effort to "love our neighbors" by dropping your dollar in the soup pot on February 5th.

Our Youth Group has selected Hands of Mercy Enterprises (HOME) of Roane County to



receive our donation.

# Hands of Mercy serves:

- Elderly persons in the county who must try to live off \$600 a month in Social Security plus perhaps \$10 in Food Stamps
- Single mothers with children who receive little or no child support from their children's father.
- Families whose breadwinner is out of work due to unemployment or illness.
- Those underemployed in our community who work, but whose job cannot support their families.

## Session Highlights

- 1) Annual reports are due in the church office by February 8. An electronic version of the annual booklet will be sent via e-mail before the Annual Congregational/Corporate meeting which is on February 26. A few hard copies will be available for pickup.
- 2) Nancy King and Celia Simon were elected as the two elders for the 2012 Nominating Committee. Three members of the congregation will be elected to the 2012 Nominating Committee at the February 26 Annual meeting.
- 3) The session meetings for 2012 will be 12:15 p.m. on the third Sunday of each month.

- 5) Elder Harris gave an update on the amphitheater project. For those of you who may not be familiar with this project, the location would be in the bowl area behind our church. Several Bethel people have spent many months working on the project and will oversee the construction. In early January an architectural drawing showing the proposed design, a brochure providing an overview of the project, and a brief set of construction specifications were given to the City of Kingston for approval. If the City approves the amphitheater, the

City will submit an application to TVA asking for approval for construction (TVA owns the majority of the land on which the amphitheater would be built). Funding will come from donations, grants, etc., but NOT from Bethel church funds. Once completed, the amphitheater would be a gift to Kingston, with the Parks and Recreation Department being responsible for the scheduling of community events.
