Immigration Policy Reform

Immigration is complicated and the media often highlight short sound bites and controversial viewpoints, which contributes to misinformation and inaccuracies. The confusion and misinformation surrounding immigration can serve to discourage us from looking at this area of U.S. policy. Nonetheless, it is vitally important that we understand what the law is and how it affects families and communities. Immigrants, both documented and undocumented, are members of the body of Christ and local communities. The General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) has issued policy statements that recognize when part of the body suffers, we all suffer with it.

The members of his class and others interested in learning about the Presbyterian Church's stand on immigration issues are invited to attend this timely class.

Bethel's Landscape

Jill McMaster asked the Landscape Committee a question: "What is the special designation Bethel has for its landscaping"?

There was no special designation for Bethel's landscape, but after back and forth e-mail's between Landscape Committee members the name Bethel's Sanctuary Gardens was chosen as the title. The word sanctuary was chosen because it reflects our commitment to a sustainable environment for nature and people. Sanctuary can mean a place of refuge, safety, or a nature reserve. The word gardens reflects that the Bethel landscape is composed of different gardens. Several of our gardens were planted and are maintained by husband/ wife teams: other areas were planted and are maintained by a Bethel lady. Ducks lay eggs in several of the gardens, and we have birds nesting. Our gardens are a work in progress.

You may remember that in 2009 there was red dirt in all the garden areas when we got back in our space after renovations. The Landscape Committee expresses appreciation to the congregation for their patience as we have developed the gardens. All the gardens have really multiplied since 2009. We often hear praise from Bethel and non-Bethel people.

The Landscape Committee expresses thanks to Frank Harris for helping to control the bermuda grass and the weeds and to the all the Bethel people who

mow the grass. Thanks to Jim Schall for building the little bridge between Bethel's parking lot and the apartment complex.

Marketplace Ice Cream (from VBS)

2/3 cup milk 2 TBSP evaporated milk 1-1/2 TBSP sugar 1/4 tsp. vanilla

- Stir ingredients together
- Pour into a quart-sized Ziplock bag; seal the bag.
- Place 1/2 cup rock salt and crushed ice in a gallon-sized Ziplock bag.
- Now put the quart size bag inside the larger bag. Seal the gallon-size bag.
- Hand the bag back and forth to a friend. (hold the top of the bag — the bottom gets cold.
- In about five minutes your ice cream will be ready to eat! Yum-m-m-m!

Since 1982, when Gene Banker, Mark's Dad, came to visit Jerry at the KOA camp ground on Watts Bar, Jerry and I have experienced the love and fellowship of this unique and incredibly loving congregation. To name a few, there was Katy Banker who had us to "sup" her great soup meals, Dick Hettrick helped Jerry with his second building project by "shooting the grade" for the "out building" foundation, our neighbor down the road Gary Griffith helped Jerry demolish a cabin and reconstruct it at our farm and the Pickels talked with Jerry about football, and we came to fellowship suppers and we listened to the word of God in this historic building.

We celebrated the Christening of our youngest granddaughter, Jennifer in this sanctuary. It was a public announcement that as a family we would share our faith in Christ with her and with this church family. The wonderful years, following this event, were filled with the youth producing Christmas pageants, picnics at the Hettricks, youth auctions to vie for famous cakes, old time song feasts, and hundreds of worship services that filled our hearts with the messages in the Bible regarding love and how to love, helping and how to help, and serving as the Lord Jesus taught us to serve.

The services for Easter sunrise were always uniquely special. Blessed with the setting of water we could think about Jesus calming the waters and how he calms our fears, the peace of water at sunrise brought inward peace to us knowing He was there, and the sunrise over the hilltops told us that there was the promise of another day if we only believe.

I will share, that in the middle of the night, while Jerry laid waiting for the sunrise, he talked to God and told Him he was ready to go. It was a private conversation and he probably thought I was asleep in my recliner. Jerry was private about his faith and never prayed in public, he was even short on words for blessings at meals and became emotional, when thanking or expressing anything personal out loud in front of a group. Many of youth that he coached have expressed that he taught them by example to be true to high principles. He respected the worth of others, and although he was a serious competitor, was fair and appreciated the effort of all who played the game.

June 8, 2013, Bethel members and our family and friends, celebrated the life of Jerry and his belief that so as new birth brings happiness in the form of a child, that new birth brings happiness from a life well lived in the arms of God.

Our family thanks you all for the nurturing, the loving, the outward deeds of cards food and phone calls, during Jerry's final days of his journey. No words are adequate, but please know that all of you are loved and appreciated by Teri, Leslie, Mitchell, Leigh, and Jennifer (daughters and grandchildren.)
