### Dear Friends,

At Big Tent in early August, I learned of the three Critical Global Initiatives (CGI) recently launched by the World Mission agency of the Presbyterian Church USA. I share briefly with you here about these initiatives and encourage you to go online to <a href="https://www.pcusa.org">www.pcusa.org</a> to find out more. Certainly at Bethel in the weeks and months to come, we will be learning more about the initiatives and how we can participate in them.

The CGIs came out of discussions with our partners particularly in the global South. They are: poverty reduction, evangelism, and reconciliation in cultures of violence. Each CGI has a goal to get started. Global mission and our partners hope to begin to reduce poverty through education, particularly education of girls. We know that education helps families do better, especially if the mother is educated.

The goal is to provide quality education for 100,001 children in the US and around the world by 2020. The second CGI, evangelism, has a goal of supporting our global partners in the raising up of a new generation of pastors with skills that help grow the church and bring healing to the world. And lastly the reconciliation CGI has a goal of eliminating violence against girls and women the world over.

The World Mission agency seeks to organize hundreds of PC (USA) congregations around each of these three challenges and thereby meet the goals that have been set. And so I wonder how God is calling us at Bethel to engage these Critical Global Initiatives. I encourage you to pray about that with me, ponder, discern and keep your eyes and ears and hearts open to hear God speak and show us the way.

To help us in our discernment, we are excited to have Amanda Craft and Omar Chan with us at Bethel on Sunday, Sept 8. Amanda and Omar are mission co-workers in Guatemala and Mexico. They will share with us during Sunday School at 9:30 in the Fellowship Hall as well as in worship at 11am in the sanctuary. Be sure to be there to hear about the work they are doing, how they will be engaging the CGIs and how we might partner with them.

It is an exciting time to be a Presbyterian – together with God, we will change the world making it a better place for all.
