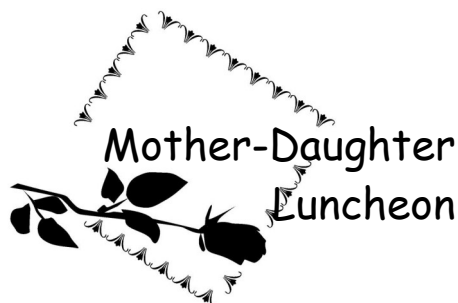

Detroit Michigan

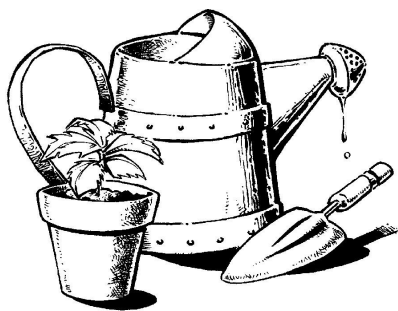
