September was a full and fulfilling month at Bethel. The Church picnic was a delightful time of fellowship and good food. The Fall Festival was a lot of work but also a lot of fun as we welcomed the community, enjoyed a beautiful day together and raised money for community ministries. The last Sunday of the month we learned from the International Peacemaker and her ministry at Frontera de Cristo on the border between the USA and Mexico and we dedicated 50 school kits and 50 hygiene kits that will help the migrant children on the border. Your generosity in giving to the kits allowed us to surpass our goal of 20 each and have about \$700 left to send to Presbyterian Disaster Assistance for the ministry with children on the border. October will not be quite as full as September but we do

look forward to World Communion Sunday, October 5 and the Peacemaking Offering the same Sunday. We will round out the month with Reformation Sunday On Oct 26 when we celebrate our Reformed Faith Heritage.

RCCM service opportunities

Roane County Cooperative Ministries has been providing aid to families living in poverty since its inception in 1991. Our own Rev. Dick Hettrick was instrumental in its formation and many Bethel members are still involved as volunteers. RCCM Director, John Leitnaker, is spearheading efforts to move beyond helping families survive in poverty to assisting them with tools needed to move out of poverty.

John sums it up by saying, "We have been doing the same thing for a long time and we are still getting the same poor results. Now there are new methods to use in the fight on poverty. These methods have been used elsewhere with success and we need to implement them here". Programs like *Bridges Out Of Poverty* and *Circles* are proving highly successful nationwide; *Circles* was recently featured on NPR

On the 8th of October "Bridges Out Of Poverty" training will be offered. This course has been highly praised by pastors, social workers, teachers, medical personnel, and church members. They find a methodology that helps them understand how we can have substantially greater impact. Even if you are not from a "helping profession", there are many ways you can help. Volunteer opportunities with RCCM include:

- Crisis support – Rent and utility

assistance provided at RCCM Network building

- Support Action Team – Finding solutions to unmet needs and verification of needs; maintaining benefactor contacts
- Development Team – Developing and implementing fundraising plans
- Administrative Support- Many types of administrative support are needed, including call-backs, database updates, managing the phones, typing, and record keeping



- Education – Teaching classes and class support activities
- Circles Team and Circles "Allys" – Support Circles participants in overcoming obstacles as they move out of poverty
- Data base management – Fostering collaboration through maintenance of the network communication tool, collecting data, producing reports/metrics that will help us move forward
- Communications- Offer support with website/electronic media, brochures, etc.
- Benefactors – Can provide gifts to particular categories or can be "on call" for help

RCCM has relocated to 733 East Race Street, in Kingston. Your support is needed now more than ever to help realize the vision of eliminating poverty in our community.
