Dear Friends,

offerings and financial investment opportunities.

The workshop choices are nearly endless and run the gamut from new PCUSA Sunday School curriculum to the mission initiatives around education and poverty eradication. Interests from earth care to human trafficking are represented. There are opportunities to learn about what mission coworkers are doing around the world as well as how to encourage generous giving in a congregation. If you can think of it, I bet there is a workshop on it at Big Tent.


You can find all the workshop information as well as the general information at www.pcusa.org. Here are the basics: dates: Thur, July 30 – Sat, Aug 1; cost for commuters (which includes the program, parking and meals) is \$295 for adults; if you want to stay at UT then the cost is \$395. First child is \$150 for ages 6 and up; \$100 for 5 and under. Additional children in each family are \$75

each. The cost for children is completely inclusive of program, lodging and meals. (And our own John Knox staff will be leading the children's program.)

If you aren't sure you want to participate in workshops, but still want to participate in some way, sign up to be a volunteer – let Wendy or Will know and they will pass your name along. If you want to go but the cost is a barrier, let Wendy know. Bethel has scholarship money available to help. Also, if you have never been to Big Tent, the Presbytery Peacemaking Committee may also have scholarship funds left.

Here's the crucial information: the deadline to register for Big Tent is Friday, June 19. After that deadline, the cost increases, so please register by June 19. I hope many of you will take advantage of having a denominational gathering so close to us and be at that family reunion July 30 – Aug 1.
