That means the wall will be completed very soon. The organization working with the family was overwhelmed with such generosity and the family is very grateful.

It has been amazing to see God's hand at work in all of our plans as well as in all the things that happened which weren't planned. I look forward to see what else God will do through us as we look to develop partnership in Guatemala but also as we use our experience to make a difference here in Kingston and in the USA.

Ministry program in July and enjoyed being back in the academic environment. I am verv excited about pursing this degree and deeply appreciate your encouragement as I do so.
