### Dear Friends,

It is the season of Easter. That's right, Easter isn't just a Sunday once a year. It is a season, the time between Easter Sunday and Pentecost. It's the time we are to sing Alleluia because Jesus has risen. God has brought life where we expected death. Because Jesus lives, we live. Traditionally we have thought of this in almost exclusive terms of life after death. However, the Resurrection is about much more than just life after death.

The Resurrection is God's yes to the world's no. It is a validation of the way Jesus lived his life, proclaiming good news to the poor, recovery of sight to the blind, release to the captives, letting the oppressed go free and declaring the year of God's favor. The Resurrection is confirmation that goodness is stronger than evil, love is stronger than darkness and life is stronger than death. In this

way, the Resurrection is our call to live into the new heaven and new earth that Isaiah describes in chapter 65.

In Isaiah's description, no more will babies die, no more will people work and not have a house to live in, no more will people work the fields but not have nutritious food to eat themselves. No more will women bear children for calamity, no more will weeping and cries of distress fill the air. No more for Christ is alive. Christ is alive and so we all have the gift of abundant life. And if that is true, then it begs the question, "why do women still bear children for calamity and cries of distress still fill the air?"

That's where you and I come in. For those of us who believe in the resurrection, who know that Christ is alive, who trust that God has brought life where we expected death, we are called to live into the new heaven and new earth that Isaiah describes. We are to live our lives to make sure that no

babies die of malnutrition or preventable disease. We are to live our lives so that war is no more and no mother has to bear children for calamity. We are to live our lives so that people who work hard each day make a fair wage and can live in affordable, safe housing. We are to live our lives so that those who harvest our food can also eat healthy nutritious food. We are to live our lives expecting the wolf and the lamb to feed together. We are to live our lives so that no one is hurt and nothing is destroyed on God's holy mountain ever again.

We have a season of Easter to ponder how we do this. So pray, give thanks and live with Resurrection faith.
