### Dear Friends,

I am just back from two weeks at Columbia Theological Seminary where I took a class on the Gospel of Matthew for my Doctor of Ministry program. It was a great time of learning and renewal for me. I am grateful to you all for your support of my educational efforts. Spending two weeks immersed in the Gospel of Matthew reminded me of our call as Christians and children of God. In these days of national and international division and enmity, we are called to live differently.

Jesus preaches his Sermon on the Mount in Matthew (chapters 5-7) in which he describes what life looks like for the community of his followers. He describes what life is currently like then offers a distinct alternative. That alternative is grounded in forgiveness, reconciliation, humility, mercy and justice – God's justice, where everyone has what they need for a full and healthy

life. Jesus calls us to go to extreme lengths to keep community, to reconcile to one another. He calls us to offer forgiveness over and over and over again, knowing that forgiveness transforms individuals and communities

Jesus calls us to go beyond societal norms and love even our enemies with sacrificial, unconditional love. He calls us and models for us making space for another to thrive. And underneath all that Jesus illustrates for us as a faithful way of life is right relationship with God and one another. When we seek right relationship, then we don't worry that someone is getting something that is ours, or something more than we have. We don't talk about who's in and who's out; we create inclusive, not exclusive communities. We put all of our trust in the God who created, redeemed and sustains us in transforming love. In the

community of Jesus' followers, in the Kingdom of God, there are no fences, no walls, no boundaries. Everyone is welcome, everyone is valued, everyone is loved, especially the vulnerable, the marginal, the poor, the least among us.

That is a tall order to be sure. But if that is who we are called to be – those who live into the Kinadom of God here and now - then our witness to that Kinadom is vitally important now. Regardless of the rhetoric on the national and local stage; regardless of the chaos that seems to swirl all around us, we know who we are and what we are called to do. Supporting, encouraging and loving one another, let us then commit ourselves to living into the Kingdom of God here and now for the sake Jesus Christ and the world he loves so much.

#### RIP: Amphitheater behind Bethel

In February of 2015, the Three Rivers Amphitheater (3RA) project team agreed to come under the management authority of the City of Kingston so that the tax-exempt status of all donations to the project could be guaranteed. Part of that agreement was that the project team would have until December 31, 2016 to raise the funding needed to complete the construction phase of the project.

It is with regret that the 3RA Team could not raise the funds needed to complete the proiect within the required time frame established by the City. Therefore, on January 3, 2017 the team mailed contribution refund checks to all identified donors and have voided all pledges. We especially regret not being able to build a brick walkway behind the amphitheater that garnered so much support. The walkway was to have memorialized/honored friends and families and to have recognized businesses.

The 3RA Team wanted to let everyone know that the City is pursuing an opportunity for a State of Tennessee Grant to build a larger amphitheater at Southwest Point. The 3RA Team fully supports that effort if it comes to fruition, but at this point we do not know any more details. The Southwest Point location offers the space for a larger multi-function facility. However, such grants are always uncertain, until delivered.
