## Pentecost Offering

The Pentecost Offering is one of four denominational offerings received throughout the year. This offering is for children at risk, youth and young adults. Sixty percent of the money we received goes to the PCUSA to support programs such as The Educate a Child, Transform the World initiative to improve the quality of education for 1 million children in the US and abroad by 2020, the Young Adult Volunteer in Mission program which sends young adults around the world to witness what God is doing and to participate in the work of the church in those places, and the Youth Triennium, the once every three year national youth event that brings over 5000 Presbyterian youth together to study, worship, place and serve.

Forty percent of the offering we receive stays in the local congregation. This year our 40% will go to Presbyterian Disaster Assistance specifically for the famine in Sudan. PDA has committed to funding the first year of the Food Security Project in South Sudan to ensure that children do not die of starvation and malnutrition. Know that your offering will be used faithfully on behalf of children, youth and young adults around the world.
