

- The church office will be closed on Wednesday, July 4th






Summer is the perfect time to gaze at the wonders in the sky. Make this craft as a reminder of God's handiwork — including you!

### What you need:

- Glass jar
- Permanent marker
- Glue (and water)
- Paper plate
- Paintbrush
- Star sequins
- Battery-operated tea light

#### What you do:

- Around the jar's opening, write in permanent marker: Shine ... like stars in the sky. Philippians 2:15
- Pour some glue on the plate. Thin with some water.
- "Paint" the outside of the jar with glue and then sprinkle on some sequins. Let dry.
- Add the tea light and give your bedroom a starry glow at nighttime.
