Dear Friends,

After a brief sabbatical of sorts following our Birthday Celebrations, church programs are resuming full force this week. We kick off our Christian Education and Formation programs on Sunday, Aug 5 with a Rally Day breakfast at 9:30 followed by promotion for children and youth. Adults will have an opportunity to hear about Adult Sunday school classes and other educational opportunities after the children and youth have been dismissed to their classes.

Churches tend to emphasize Christian education for children but not so much for adults. This year we are going to try to change that here at Bethel. To that end, we are continuing the Wednesday evening Supper and Study program that began during Lent. I will lead an adult study on the book of Ruth paying particular attention to the place of the stranger in God's covenant with God's people. That study will continue through the month of August. Cyndi Fowler will then lead a study on the book, *Being Mortal*, in the month of September. There will be games and activities for children and youth during the adult Bible study on Wednesday Supper and Study nights.

The Women's Bible study that meets on the second and fourth Thursday from 10:30 to 12 will pick up in Genesis with the story of Jacob and Esau's meeting after years of estrangement. If you are interested or have a friend that would like to study with us, join us. We will do some review on Aug 9 to catch everyone up, so new comers will not feel behind.

A youth Sunday school class is being reformed this year for 6th-12th grade. I will teach a study of I and II Samuel during the months of August and September. Further topics will emerge for the next few months. Children will be divided into two classes. 4k-1st grade will be with Ms. Marilyn and Ms. Joan building a strong foundation of Bible studies. 2nd grade through 5th grade will utilize a rotation model curriculum to study the creation story and begin to build on their foundation of faith. A variety of teachers will accompany them on this rotation journey.

There are many ways for you to engage in Christian education and formation this fall. I hope you will take advantage of them and let the Study team know if there are particular topics you would like to study on Wednesdays or during the Sunday school hour. Friends are always welcome so don't hesitate to share the exciting things we are doing.

BUMBLE EE BAll

Make these yummy treats as a summer snack.

What you need:

- 1 cup peanut butter
- 1½ oz. instant oats
- ¼ cup honey
- ½ cup instant milk powder
- ½ cup dark chocolate chips
- 40 mini chocolate chips
- 20 slivered almonds
- 40 sliced almonds
- Adult help OK

What you do:

- 1. In a bowl, mix peanut butter, oats, honey and instant milk powder into dough. If too dry, add more peanut butter or honey.
- 2. Roll dough into 20 long balls. Place them on a cookie sheet and refrigerate.
- 3. Melt the dark chocolate chips and place them in a zippered baggie. Cut a tiny bit off one corner.
- 4. Remove dough from refrigerator. Squeeze thin lines of chocolate as stripes onto the bee bodies.
- 5. Use two mini chocolate chips for eyes, a slivered almond for a stinger and two sliced almonds as wings. Enjoy!


