# Service Outing Opportunity

Service outings near and far have long been an important part of Bethel's outreach. While visiting the Southwest in October, I explored prospects for an outing next summer. Since returning, I met with Reverend Neff and Service Team Chair, Sue Jones and exchanged follow-up e-mails with my SW contacts. At this early juncture, here are some tentative and general details about a <u>possible</u> outing.

- Several small, largely Hispanic Presbyterian churches in northern New Mexico and the Ganado Presbyterian Church on the Navajo Reservation (AZ) have indicated that they have needs that we might help them complete next summer. These include several small-scale carpentry, home repairs, and landscaping projects.
- This would require a mixed generational group of 12-15 participants that would include several adults with skills suitable to these tasks, energetic and willing youths, and several additional adults to work with the young people.
- Based on schedules here and out there, the second half of July appears to me the most opportune time for this to happen. Depending on travel arrangements, the outing would last somewhere between eight and twelve days.

Other details - including projected individual costs - will depend on responses to this opportunity. Toward that end, we will have an **organizational meeting after worship on Sunday January 12 in the Barber Library.**

# Christmas Eve Candlelight Communion Worship





# Light the Way

Make some Christmas candles to remember Jesus, the Light of the world



### What you need:

- Unlined white notecards
- Hot glue (and adult help)
- Yellow tissue paper
- Mini muffin liners
- Clothespins

### What you do:

- 1. Roll a notecard from side to side into a "candle" tube. Secure with glue.
- 2. Insert a piece of tissue paper "flame" in one end.
- 3. Glue the other end to a muffin liner. Then glue the liner to a clothespin.
- 4. Repeat to make many paper candles. Pin them to the branches of a Christmas tree.
