Dear Friends,

I hope you are doing well in these unusual days. This edition of the Open Door will be a bit different since there are no normal church activities right now. I hope that it will still be a source of information and joy and a way to stay up to date with prayer concerns. Thank you all for the ways you have reached out to me and each other to offer support and care. I am grateful to be part of such a generous and caring faith community. I am also grateful that you continue to join me for worship via Facebook Live. It is not a perfect forum by any means, but it has allowed most of us to worship and allowed for many Bethel folks in far flung places to join with us too. I look forward to the day, though, when we can safely return to worship and I can see your faces as you sit in your regular pews.

When we first had to suspend normal church activities, I just jumped in to do Facebook live without any experience and practically no knowledge. Along the way, I have figured out how high my laptop needs to be so you see my face straight on. I have tweaked the lighting in my home office and sought to add worship elements to the bookshelves that serve as the backdrop to our worship services. I have thought about what is important for worship and what we can let go in these unusual days.

My first and foremost thought all along has been to NOT try to make this worship normal. I have continued to celebrate worship from my house because you are also in yours. I don't wear my robe because I know that many of you are likely in your pajamas. I have included hymns because for me singing is an element of worship that we can't let go of. I'm grateful to have music to accompany our singing, and I know it's weird to sing from your couch. I'll share it has tested my vulnerability tremendously. It's one thing to sing with the kids, but it's another all together to sing with my very imperfect voice for the whole world (practically) to hear.

Technology has allowed us this opportunity to continue to live in a rhythm of worship. Technology is also imperfect. April 19 proved that for sure. As I was unaware that the worship had stopped, I kept on preaching, singing, praying - clueless that you were no longer with me. I was TERRIBLY frustrated when I learned what happened. And for a moment I thought about how I could record worship so maybe it wouldn't happen again that you were cut short. But for me worship is an act of the gathered community, one worth the risks of technological mishaps in order to know you are worshiping with me. It is hard to see my face looking back at me each Sunday, but I can do it because I know your faces are on the other side of so many screens looking back at me too. And that is gathered enough for me in these moments.

My colleagues around the presbytery and beyond are all doing what feels best for them and their congregations. Some services are recorded and professional. Others are on Zoom instead of Facebook live. Some aren't doing services at all but simply preaching. We are all doing the best we can in the moment. What is working for us wouldn't work for another church and vice versa. And all of us know that there are some among us who are and will be left out no matter what or how we worship. My heart grieves that reality in these days. It makes me thankful for phone calls and snail mail to keep those off the internet grid still connected and part of the larger community of faith.

Friends, thank you for your patience and your willingness to jump in new waters with me these days. Until we can gather in the sanctuary, know I'll do my best to keep tweaking worship to be meaningful and am grateful each Sunday to know you are sitting on your couches worshiping with me.

Make this cute puppet to show and tell the amazing story of metamorphosis.



What you need:

- Needle and Scissors string
 - · Googly eyes • Glue
- 12 small pom-poms
 - Coffee filter Markers
- Wooden craft stick

What you do:

- 1. Sew pom-poms together to make a caterpillar body. Tie off that string.
- 2. Thread another string up through the first pompom, leaving 12 inches to dangle. Repeat with the ninth pom-pom, leaving two dangling strings.
- 3. Wrap those strings around opposite ends of the stick, adjusting their length to about 6 inches. Tie in place.
- Glue on eyes.
- Flatten the coffee filter and draw a symmetrical design on it. Pleat in the center to create wings.
- 6. Move the caterpillar puppet by holding the stick. Glue on the wings as you describe the transformation into a butterfly.
