Session Highlights

Worship Attendance: June 2022 average in-person Sanctuary attendance was 52 (from Sanctuary tablet) and the June 2022 average Facebook Worship attendance was 144.

The new fire resistant cabinet for the Bethel office arrived on July 6, 2022, and is now in use.

Property Team – Bethel's Safety Plan was updated and approved by the Session. The purpose of the Plan is to convey in broad terms our plans in the event of the unexpected. The Plan covers three types of emergencies: 1) presence of a threatening person; 2) Fire; and 3) Impending Storm Event.

The Sunday morning Sexton Duties were reimplemented on June 12, 2022.

Service Team - Susan Garner met with the Session and made a presentation about GriefShare. This is a 13-week, Christ-centered support group seminar for people who have lost a spouse, child, family member, or friend through death. A portion of each session will features a video presentation on topics like comfort, answers and hope. The Service Team brought a motion to the session asking for approval to have this seminar at Bethel for the Bethel Family and for the community. The Session supported this motion, and the motion passed.

The next Presbytery meeting is Saturday, August 13, 2022 at Madisonville Presbyterian Church. Current elder Chuck Bunch volunteered to attend. Bethel can have two Commissioners. Is there a former elder who would also like to attend this Presbytery Meeting as a

Commissioner? If so, please contact Cathy ASAP so that you can get registered for the meeting. Attendance can be either in-person or via Zoom.

Notes from Rev Nancy

Dear Friends,

Our family friend Eric Minton has recently published a book with the title It's Not You, It's Everything: What Our Pain Reveals About the Anxious Pursuit of the Good Life. We met Eric when he served as the youth director at our former church during our youngest son Sam's high school years. It was Eric who kept Sam attending the Baptist church for a couple of years after my husband and I had called it quits. Any positive feelings Sam may still harbor toward the Christian faith are mostly attributable to Eric. Today, he and his wife Lindsay serve as licensed therapists at Minton Family Therapy in Knoxville.

Because our family loves Eric and considers him wise beyond his years and because this is the closest I've ever been to a published author, I was eager to buy the book. As the title suggests, the basic premise is that, yes, a lot of people are hurting and are concerned about the future. But in light of the realities of this particular time in history—the weakening of democracy at home and abroad, an alienation exacerbated by social media, an unveiled racism, an increase in violence, record-breaking heat waves attributable to climate change, and of course, a global pandemic that we pretend is over but really isn't—it should come as no surprise that we are not okay. What we feel is the natural response to the world we inhabit. If we are not feeling some anxiety, perhaps we are not paying enough attention.

For those of us who are paying attention, though, we struggle with what our response should be. How do we live faithfully? How can we work for change? How do we make a difference. when the challenges are so immense? It can feel like a reasonable form of self care to stick our heads in the sand and hope the problems just go away. But as followers of Jesus Christ, called each Sunday to pray "Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven," we don't really have that option. We each have our role to play in the bringing of God's kingdom. And so may we draw near to God, seeking the Spirit's guidance, praying these words from an early twentieth century hymn:

Grant us wisdom, grant us courage, for the living of these days, for the living of these days.

In so doing, may we find the strength to live as faithful disciples in our world.

You may be asking yourself "What ever happened to the Transition Team?" We are pleased to announce that at the July meeting of session, we approved the team which will help lead us through the transition

process. I appreciate those of you who took the time to make suggestions regarding who you would like to see serve in this capacity.

Introducing a new Bethel ministry: Collection of Bingo Items for the Love Kitchen

The Love Kitchen outreach at the First Presbyterian Church in Rockwood touches 60-80 people — adults, teenagers, elementary school kids, and preschoolers — for food and companionship, and it recently celebrated its 20th anniversary. Bethel has been providing mealsto the Love Kitchen in rotation with many other groups for over 12 years. However, there are now fewer Rockwood individuals providing "loot" for the Bingo games that are held after dinner. We hope that Bethel can supply Wilma with 20-30 prizes per month.
