There were dozens and dozens of people giving generously of their time and talents, especially during the weeks leading to our big move! If I listed all who participated... I would be sure to leave someone out. So, to those of you who helped...our grateful thanks for your thoughtfulness and love!

Seeing Is Believing...

When you walk into the worship space, how do you know you are in a place of worship? When I walk into a worship space, I'm looking for the table, the font, and the pulpit...it's possible to tell a lot about a congregation by seeing where these pieces of furniture are placed. So, what are we saying at Bethel as you look upon our new sanctuary arrangement?

Every time I walk into a worship space I want to be reminded of baptism—Christ's, my own, and the baptismal promises we have made. In baptism, we are sealed. We die to what separates us from God and are raised to newness of life in Christ.

What about the pulpit? This is the place where God's word is read and proclaimed. The church confesses the Scriptures to be the Word of God written, witnessing to God's self-revelation. Where that Word is read and proclaimed, Jesus Christ the Living Word is present!

As for the communion table, we are gathering to celebrate the Eucharistic meal of our Lord, and it's a big deal...a very big deal! It's not just a table to hold the flowers... The Lord's Supper is the sign of eating and drinking in communion with the crucified and risen Lord. Look for the table to be set symbolically, even when we are not celebrating communion. We want to be reminded each and every week that we are renewed and sustained by Christ. In

remembering, believers receive and trust the love of Christ present to them and to the world.

The furniture in a space for worship makes it a place for worship. Every member of our congregation (children, youth and adults) and our honored guests learn about our faith through what we do together in that place with the table, the font, and the pulpit. The arrangement is a visual representation of what we believe and what we hold dear. What are we teaching them about our Reformed identity? If it looks a little different to you, know that we intentionally arranged the furniture to bring the Word and the Sacraments into prominence.

You'll also notice that we no longer have a modesty rail. No, we didn't run out of money! We intentionally opened the space to visually proclaim that everyone has direct access to the Word and the Sacraments, not just the worship leaders.

The Book of Order tells us that the arrangement of space should visibly express the integral relation between Word and Sacrament and their centrality in Christian worship [W-1.3024]. We have attempted to arrange the furniture in such a way that when people look upon the arrangement, they will know what we believe.

From the Parish Nurse

Spring is here and children are getting out and becoming more active. A recent news report related the tragic death of actress Natasha Richardson from what appeared to be a minor fall suffered while skiing. Serious trauma to the head may include bleeding internally, even though the person feels fine and appears to have no symptoms. Dr. James J. McCarthy, assistant professor of emergency medicine at the University of Texas, Medical School at Houston noted "You've got confined space inside the skull, and blood from the injured blood vessels flows into the same space that the brain occupies. This growing clot of blood starts taking up more and more space, and puts pressure on and decreases the flow of oxygen to the brain." This pressure causes the tremendous headache the patient feels. The brain can literally be squeezed to death.



Children or persons with normal blood-clotting ability may be less likely to experience internal bleeding. However, persons on blood thinners would be at a much higher risk. The most serious symptom associated with pressure on the brain is unconsciousness. Other symptoms may include headache, weakness, balance problems and nausea or vomiting. Any head injury followed by these symptoms requires immediate medical attention. As always, to your health.....Deb

Peggy needs assistance as we have "gone green" with communion service. Trays of filled communion cups are much heavier and by using glass cups, they need to be washed and stored after each use. The Worship Committee is purchasing dishwasher trays to assist with the washing!

Décor in the sanctuary changes with the liturgical calendar, so if you've got an eye for style, please sign up to assist with the décor under the leadership of the pastors.

WORSHIP LEADERS—At Bethel, we believe that “In Jesus Christ, the Church is a royal priesthood in which worship is the work of everyone.” [BOO W-1.4003] The people are called to participate. We need elders to serve communion, children AND YOUTH to serve as acolyte/ushers to carry the light and collect the offering, readers to serve as liturgists, and men and women over the age of 18 to assist our Nursery Worker in providing care to the little ones so that their parents may participate in the worship service and be restored.

In the narthex on the table outside the main sanctuary entrance, you will find a three-ring binder with all these opportunities for Christian Stewardship outlined. We ask that you intentionally pray over this request and listen closely to what God is calling you to do at Bethel PCUSA. If you hear God calling you to serve in this way, all you have to do is say, “Here I Am, Lord” and sign-up and serve! If you hear God calling you to coordinate any of these activities...please let a member of the Pastoral Leadership Team or the Worship Committee know. There are many members of the body who may not be able to physically participate in these activities, but you could really work a phone! We are VERY OPEN to having volunteer coordinators who would recruit folks for any or all of these activities by phone.

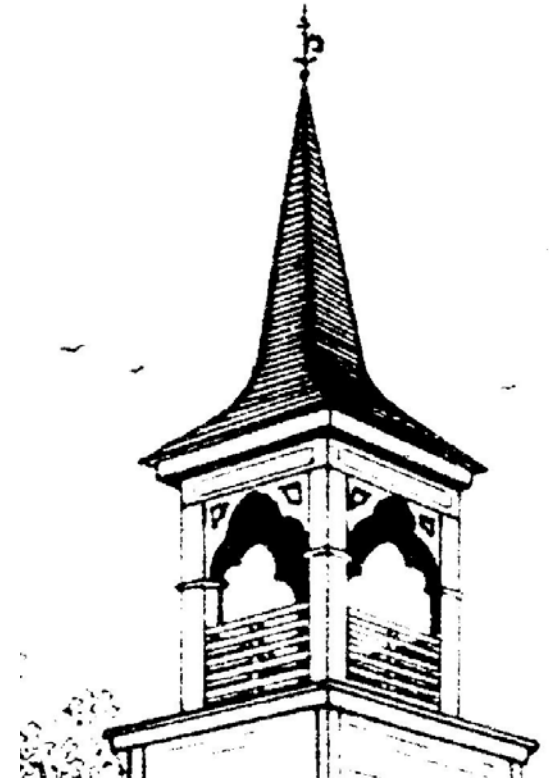
